
Application Checklist

Before submitting your required application, please confirm you have the following items:

- → Completed Application Form, which includes the following:
 - Owner's Name and Mailing address/contact information
 - ☐ Current Status of Title (dated within 30 days of application)
 - ☐ Tax Roll Number /Civic Address and/or Legal Description
 - ☐ Letter of Authorization
 - ☐ Site Plan
 - ☐ Plan Review Fee
 - ☐ Construction drawings Engineer's seal may be required (Maximum paper size 11"x17")

Do I require any other permits or approvals?


- Developer's approval may be required dependant on the area of construction.
- Manitoba Department of Infrastructure and Transportation approval is required if any structure or use is located within a highway control corridor or intersection circle; and, for any planting within 50 feet of a Provincial Road or Highway Right-of-Way.
- A Geotechnical Report may be required when construction occurs within 350 feet of the Red River, Lake Winnipeg, or a tributary.
- Other permits or approvals may be required.

SMALL TENTS AND CANOPIES

Do I require a permit to place a small tent or canopy on my property?

Tent and Canopy structures are regulated by the Manitoba Building Code. Structures over 120 sq. ft. require a building permit, in accordance with Municipal Building By-laws.

Exceptions to this Manitoba Building Code requirement are noted below.

Regardless of size, small tents and canopies must conform to regulating Zoning and Building By-Laws. This means that structures must be set back a minimum amount of distance from other structures and property lines depending on your property's zoning. If you provide our office with your Municipality and your tax roll number, we can provide you with your Zoning setback information.

If the Tent or Canopy is not of standard wood frame construction, professional engineer involvement would be required. This is required to ensure the structure will withstand wind and snow loads and is properly anchored to the ground.

What if the tent is for a special event, such as a wedding, on our property?

Please refer to the Temporary Structures and Uses Brochure for information.

What if the small tent or canopy is seasonal, being erected each spring and taken down each autumn?

A temporary placement permit may be required.
